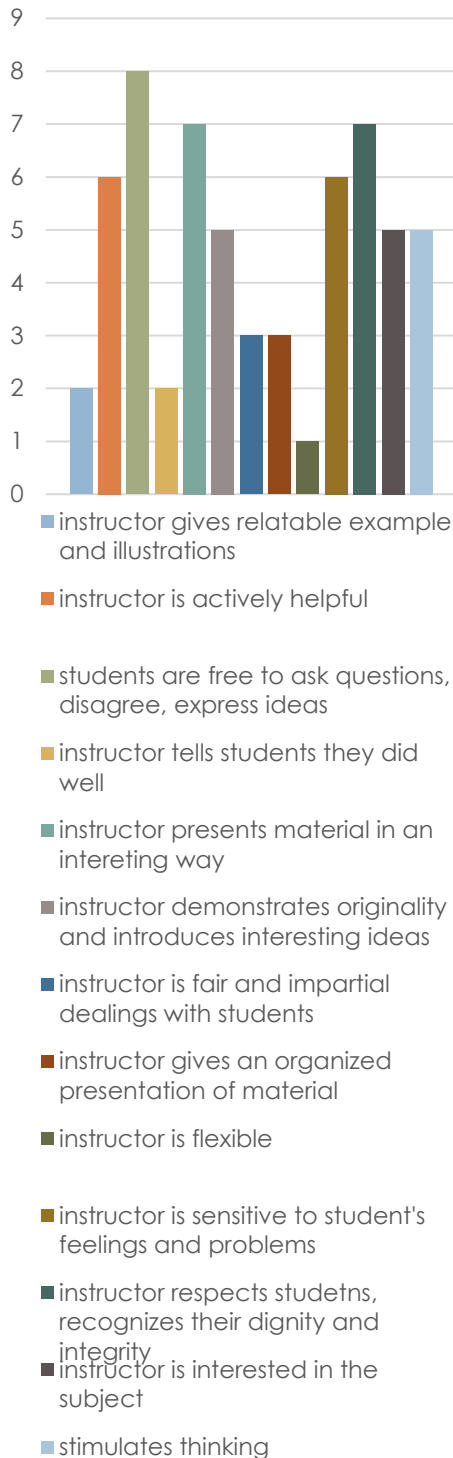

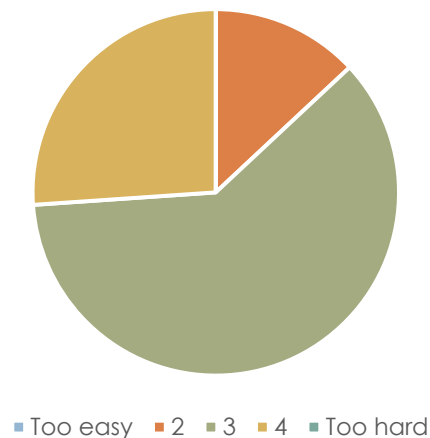

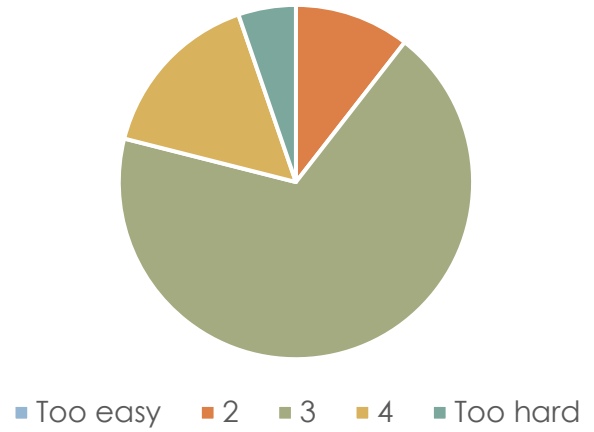
STUDENT EVALUATION SAMPLE
